Bamboo Rib Coffee Cozy



The Bamboo Rib Coffee Cozy features an intriguing rib pattern worked at a firmer than usual gauge, which helps keep your cup warmer and your fingers cooler. Work in the round on dpns, 2 circulars, or magic loop: knitter's choice! These are a great way to use up leftover worsted weight yarn.



Yarn: Knitted Wit Gobstoppers 16g/35 yard mini-skein, worsted weight 100% superwash merino wool
<u>Gauge</u>: 14 sts/2 inches in Bamboo Rib stitch, unstretched
<u>Needles</u>: US #3/3.25 mm dpns, or 2 circulars or one long circular for magic loop
<u>Notions</u>: Tapestry needle
<u>Finished measurements</u>: 7 inches circumference, 3 inches tall. Will fit standard 12 or 16 ounce paper coffee cups (tall and grande, to some)

Abbreviations

 \underline{K} - knit \underline{P} - purlK1tbl - knit 1 through the back loop \underline{EOR} - end of round $\underline{st, sts}$ - stitch, stitches

Technique: BambooTwist2

<u>BambooTwist2</u> – Slip 2 sts purlwise. Lift first st over second st and return both sts to left needle in this reversed order. K1, K1tbl. Bamboo Rib is created by alternating rounds of K2, P1 with rounds of BambooTwist2, P1.

Instructions

Cast on 48 sts; divide evenly on 3 dpns (or 2 circulars, or magic loop) and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist.

Rnd 1: K2, P1; repeat to end of round.

Rnd 2: BambooTwist2, P1; repeat to end of round.

Repeat rounds 1 and 2 until 22 rounds are complete, or to desired height, ending with a BambooTwist2 round.

Finishing

Bind off all sts in K2, P1 pattern. Weave in ends.
